

New team set to clean up Peasedown Play Park

A team of councillors in Peasedown St John are taking action to clean up one of their local recreational play areas.

Beacon Field, which is located in the centre of the village, is used regularly by families and dog walkers.

Cllr Karen Walker, who as well as being chairman of the local Planning Committee is also a member of the PACT panel and an organiser of the Party in the Park festival.

She wants to see more done to clean up the park:

“The condition of the litter bins is poor. They all either need to be replaced or given an extreme makeover. This will add to the positive feel that residents have when they use the park.”

Cllr Walker is working with Parish Councillor Jo Davis, and B&NES Councillors Sarah Bevan and Nathan Hartley.

The team have already achieved some success, including:

- * News from the Parks and Open Spaces Department that they will replace the signs at the entrance to the field, which have become worn over the years.

- *The repair of broken children’s play equipment.

- * The repair of two broken fences at the edge of the play park

Cllr Walker (pictured) added:

“More work still needs to be done though. The next stage in our campaign is to clean up these litter bins.

Beacon Field is an essential part of our community. It brings people from both parts of the village together and serves Beacon Hall well when they hold events that need outside use.

We hope to organise a clean-up event here soon. When we do, local residents will be invited to come along and take part.”
