


New Christmas Lights



The Parish Council has ordered some new eco-friendly Christmas lights for 2023. These lights are not only energy-efficient but are also made from recycled plastic bottles.

Every year 500 billion plastic bottles are produced, and unfortunately, many of them end up as litter

or in the oceans. Annually, around 8 million tons of waste make their way into the oceans, forming a massive accumulation of floating plastics roughly one-third the size of Europe. To make the lights, the plastic bottles are processed and turned into flakes, which are then used in 3D printers to create the





decorations. This approach not only reduces greenhouse gas emissions but also helps to decrease the number of plastic bottles in the environment.

Look out for the new lights which will be up ready for a 1st December switch-on.

Up-coming Projects

Councillors visited the cemetery recently to inspect the pathways around the Garden of Remembrance (pictured left), which are being considered for replacement and extension in 2024. Following a formal tendering process, they have been carefully evaluating the quotations received before appointing a contractor. A new surface would greatly improve the appearance of the pathways and should last for many years to come.

Other projects being put forward for 2024 include an irrigation system for the Jubilee Garden, an Ecological Survey of the village, reinstating a wildlife pond, putting Ashgrove Cemetery forward for a Green Flag Award and a longer-term plan to budget for the upgrade of all pathways on parish council land to bring them up to standard.

Councillors are looking at ways that they can become more involved in project work, but would love to hear from local residents too. If you have any ideas about future projects, please come along to our meetings in January (details below).

All residents are invited to attend the Parish Council's 2024/25 budget planning/setting meetings at the Finance & Amenities Committee at 7pm on Tuesday 16th January 2024 or Full Council at 7pm on 23rd January 2024 - both meetings in Beacon Hall. Electric Vehicle Charging

B&NES Council has secured some funding through the West of England Combined Authority's "Green Recovery Fund" to install Community Hub EV Chargers across the region. They have proposed that a 22kW dual socket charger unit (similar to the one pictured below) should be installed in Peasedown St John, and have asked for input from the Parish Council and local residents to



agree on the proposed location.

The suggested location is either **Greenlands Road Car Park** or **Beacon Hall Car Park**, and we would welcome your views on where you think the charger unit should go.
