Remembrance Christmas Tree

We have put up an additional Christmas tree at Ashgrove Cemetery both to provide some winter colour, and to give residents an additional opportunity to remember their loved ones at Christmas, by adding a gift tag or small decoration to the tree. This can be in memory of someone who has passed away, or a tribute to family or friends who you might not be able to see this Christmas.

A supply of laminated (blank) festive labels and ties will be provided, together with a permanent marker, so that residents can write their own tributes and tie them on the tree. Alternatively, residents may prefer to bring their own small tribute to put on the tree, from home. Community Tree Planting



The Parish Council is planning to plant 135 new trees in the village with the assistance of the Mini Police from Peasedown Primary School, the Peasedown Environment Group, and the community in December or January. Earlier in the year the Parish Council in their capacity as sole

Trustees for the Recreation Ground, agreed for planting to take place and two tree planting packs were received from The Woodland Trust. The Mini Police will plant a small copse on the Recreation Ground, and blossom trees will be planted along the path. Further planting will take place on Beacon Field and The Prince of Wales Green.

Cllr Conor Ogilvie-Davidson, Chair of the Planting Advisory Panel, commented: "The Parish Council is excited to bring a variety of new trees to the village to improve our open spaces, increase habitats for wildlife and improve our air. We're hoping to bring more trees to the Parish year-on-year and improve all of our open spaces."
