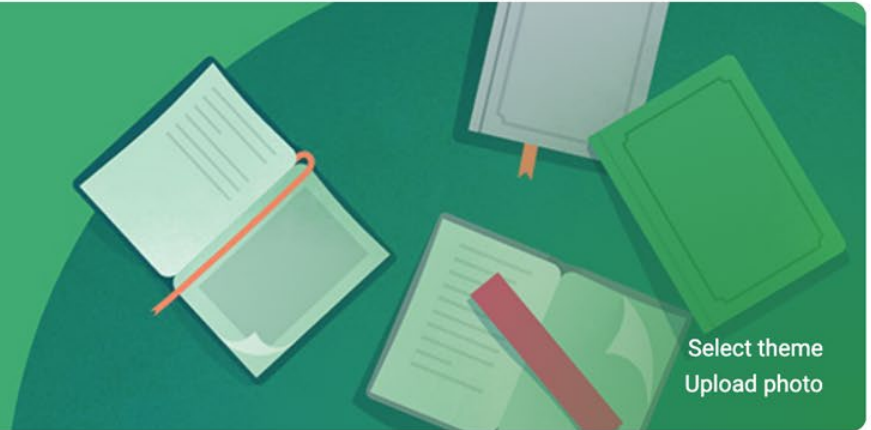

Make sure you make the best of this opportunity to plan your work fully and that you go back and re-read/edit your plan as necessary. An excellent plan will lead to excellent writing.
