Our school values - At PSJ, we care. In September, we spent time thinking about the skills, knowledge and attributes we want our pupils to develop to become successful and positive global citizens.





CURIOSITY = To ask questions and seek out knowledge to become better learners. To become critical thinkers who are inquisitive about the world around us and our place within it.



ASPIRATION = To learn from, and be inspired by, the best. To have the highest aspirations and expectations for ourselves and others, and consistently work hard to achieve these.



RESILIENCE = To develop the ability to bounce back from adversity, failure or challenges and see them as necessary steps of learning and development. To learn from mistakes, learning and developing new strategies and skills.



EQUALITY = To ensure all individuals in our community and the wider world are treated fairly and equally, no matter their race, gender, age, disability, religion or sexual orientation. Be the change you want to see in the world.

We have bought many books to engage children in these key areas—stories are a great way to introduce new and sometimes challenging ideas in a safe and inspiring way.

Alongside these are our school drivers. These underpin what we learn about here at PSJ, especially designed to influence our children and the community for the better. British Values

We aim actively to promote common values that support young people to leave school prepared for life in modern Britain. Pupils are encouraged to regard people of all faiths, races and cultures with respect and tolerance and understand that while different people may hold different views about what is 'right' and 'wrong', all people living in England are subject to its law. We encourage



children to develop a global perspective and to appreciate that these values are not just British values, but are western liberal democratic values, shared by many countries and peoples around the world.











Pupil Voice is a very important part of school life - each class has representatives who meet with school leaders to discuss school improvements. As part of the schoo council, we also visit the Houses of Parliament to learn about our Fundamental British Values. Here are the children with Jacob Rees-Mogg, our local MP.






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
