

Recreation Ground Improvements Project

We are excited to announce that works to improve the Recreation Ground will be starting this month. Some of the new features will be:

• Extension of the footpath to provide a mud-free, pushchair and wheelchairfriendly route around the Recreation Ground;

- A dropped kerb at Church Road and installation of an accessible gateway;
- Re-surfacing and improvement of the main vehicle entrance off Bath Road;
- Installation of a pedestrian gateway and steps to formalise the "unofficial" pedestrian entrance from Bath Road;
- Installation of grass re-enforcement matting in the area around the changing

rooms, to ensure that vehicles accessing the facilities will not damage the grass in wet weather. Councillors hope these works will ensure that the Recreation Ground can be accessed by all residents and will be easier to enjoy throughout the year.

The works will start on Monday 18th October 2021 and will last for around 6 weeks. The estimated completion date will be early December 2021. We will post a weekly up-date on our Facebook page to update everyone on progress.

Whilst the works are taking place, the local Scout Group has arranged for a brand new storage garage to be installed, for equipment such as tents for camping trips. The old storage containers which they had used for many years had become extremely rusty and will be removed to make way for the new footpath.

New Area at Ashgrove Cemetery

Since the creation of the Garden of Remembrance in 2013, we are now creating phase two of the cremated remains area, to provide some additional plots. The scattering area (shown right) is also being improved so that it will look pleasant all year round rather than just for a few weeks of the year.

The Burial Committee hopes to create a pleasant place for residents to sit and reflect and to remember loved ones, and will continue to make improvements to bring this about. The rules for memorials and tributes are displayed on the notice board at the cemetery.
