The Parish Council provided £60, which was awarded as part of the annual Community Grants Scheme. Cllr Mandy Clarke said: "The Residents' Association provide a weekly drop-in at St John's Close Community Hall, where visitors can access a PC to send an e-mail or apply for a job. The Parish Council grant will mean that we can offer people a cup of tea or coffee and a biscuit when they call in. The dropin takes place on a Wednesday from 1pm-3pm". New Pedestrian Gates For Our Public Open Spaces

The Parish Council has recently installed some Equality Act Compliant pedestrian gates at the entrances to the public open spaces around the village. This was partly funded by money resulting from a development in the village together with a Community Empowerment Fund Grant from B&NES Council.

We hope the gates will make it much easier for those using wheelchairs, mobility scooters, pushchairs or prams to access Beacon Field, the Recreation Ground and Ecewiche Green.

Upgrade of Parish Council Street Lights

Work is about to start to up-grade the 120 street lights owned by the Parish Council to LED. We hope that the first lights to be installed will be in Carlingcott. The remaining lights will be installed in the coming months and we hope the works will be complete in early 2019. If you have any queries about the installation, please contact the Parish Office on the number given above.

The new units will reduce energy consumption by up to 60%, whilst providing the same level of light as before. LED technology also enables the introduction of variable dimming technology, which means that light levels can be reduced later at night when the roads are less busy.

Parish Council Takes on Snow Warden Scheme

For the past six years we have been part of the Snow Warden Scheme run by Bath & N E Somerset Council. Under the scheme, the Parish Council were provided with salt and equipment so that pavements in key areas of the village could be treated in the event of severe weather, by a group of volunteers. The scheme has run successfully since then and we are very grateful to the volunteers, co-ordinated by our Snow Warden Calvin Bird, who turn out in freezing weather to keep important routes in the village clear for



pedestrians.

Earlier this year, B&NES Council announced that they would no longer provide funding for the scheme, so the Parish Council has made a decision to support it going forward. We are always on the look-out for new volunteers to help - please get in touch if you could spare some time and would be willing to get involved.

Just a reminder of the colour coding for grit bins, in case you wish to request a refill:

- green grit bins are the Parish Council

- yellow grit bins are B&NES Council
- bins on CURO areas are CURO.

You are welcome to use the salt, but please spread it thinly - one tablespoon is enough to treat one square metre.
